## Park Trails

Miller Park has two main grass trails for visitors to enjoy any time of year. During the spring season, birders will enjoy the return of the songbirds as they nest and raise their young. Summer brings wildflowers that fill the fields in the center of the park. In winter months, visitors may enjoy snowshoeing or cross-country skiing.

Miller Park trails offer close-up views of wildflowers, agricultural crops, and wetlands; all these things make Miller Park unique among the Town's park system. Interpretive signage throughout the park depicts a variety of plant and animal species that you might spot during your visit to Miller Park. Additional signage tells the story of agriculture and land protection in the town and right here at the park.

## Birdseye View Loop — — —

Approximately 1/2 mile around the outer loop

Approximately 1/10 mile across the center cut-through

Miller Park's main trail leaves the parking lot and follows the perimeter of the hillside, weaving among the wildflower fields. A cut-through path in the center of the field provides additional options to trail users. At the top of the hill in the southwest corner of the field, visitors can stop for a terrific view from the gazebo.

## Brewer Trail — — —

Approximately 7/10 mile out and back

This trail heads south from the parking lot along the edge of the fields to wander by the wetlands located near the corner of Bliss Road and State Route 21. Take a rest on the bench by the wetlands and you might be lucky enough to spot one of the many songbirds that frequent the park.

## Benches

There are several benches spaced along the park trails for our visitors' convenience plus a gazebo at the top of the hill with ample seating and beautiful views.

## A Few Reminders

Dogs are welcome but must always be kept on a leash. Please bag any waste. Bags and a waste receptacle are provided for your convenience at the entrance to the trails.

Please be courteous of our neighbors and stay within the park boundaries during your visit.
